

Thank you to the number of parent/carers who walk with their children across the playground. Unfortunately, now at the end of the day some children feel that they can start running and shouting as loudly as they can as soon as they get out towards the playground. Yesterday I intervened several times when children were charging around, without any care and attention, playing tag and sprinting, nearly knocking over children who were walking calmly and sensibly next to their parent/carers. We have spoken to each class today and would like you to please speak to your children if they are unaccompanied at the end of the day, if you allow them to walk home or if they like to 'run' away from you at the end of the day.

A calm end to the day is a nice way to start the walk home with your children, and it's certainly a lot better than some of the increasing screaming and shouting that I have seen over the last few days. Please remind your children (as we have done) it is not breaktime after school and to leave calmly without charging around and not playing on the challenge or playing any physical tag games, where other children are nearly knocked over. Thank you for your support on this.



Message from Miss Paul: World Book Day - Thursday 6th March

We kindly ask that children bring in a book of their choice to celebrate this special day. They are also welcome to dress up as a character from their book if they would like! Alternatively, if your child would prefer to wear their school uniform or casual clothes, that is perfectly fine. If they'd like, they can bring in a prop that relates to their book, such as a wand and wizard hat for a *Harry Potter* fan. Additionally, the children will be visiting the Plane Library throughout the day – can you believe it's been a whole year since it opened?

Attendance: This term alone, our attendance stands at a very impressive 97.1%, which coming out of the wintery period, with coughs and colds, is an amazing effort. Our whole school attendance is 96.21% which has seen the local authority rag rate us as green and not currently a concern. Looking at attendance locally and nationally, as of yesterday, we were in the top 10 schools in the local authority for attendance and top 10/20% schools nationally. This is a great achievement at the halfway point of the year, and it would be great to think that we can keep this going for the rest of the year. Once again can we reiterate that we totally understand when there is sickness and children are not well enough to come to school and remind you that when we meet with families and the EWO it's a supportive process. Presently, we only have 7% (15 children) across the school who are classed as persistently absent (less than 90%) and a number of these children are very close to 90%. Please keep attendance as high as possible as it helps in many ways! A huge thank you to all parents/carers!

The children represented the school impeccably throughout the day, at the rehearsal and again at the evening performance and the enjoyment on their faces during and after performing was a joy to behold. A huge thank you, once again to Mrs Macnamara, who has led dance club for several years and choreographed two amazing performances yesterday.

Behaviour Policy: Behaviour in school is generally very good, and we are very proud that most of our pupils always try to be Flying High at all times. When this is not the case, for whatever reason, we always use our restorative practices to help support children when they are having difficulties. Our approaches to this are very clear through our behaviour policy (see link below to access on our website) and when children are having difficulty, we use several strategies to enable the children to make good choices themselves, to 'turnaround' their behaviour and reset their efforts. Sometimes when this does not happen some children find themselves having reflection time with a member of SLT (Senior Leadership Team) and it is at this point that we would normally inform you directly by telephone call, face to face conversations or by messages on dojo or email. Following some work we have done




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as a staff, from the start of Term 4, if your child finds themselves having some reflection time, you will be notified by email on the same day, for you to follow up any issues with them. When things do go wrong, we endeavour to support all children and with your continued support, we know children will be aiming to be Flying High. Indeed 96% of you agreed with us in the recent OFSTED parent/ carers survey and we hope with this slight tweak will continue to enable us to improve this further.
