Elle: Year 3: I love reading because it interesting and helps me to find out more.


We love reading at St. Helen's and all children can love reading from their starting points.





As you may know and the children will testify to, one of my favourite lessons is Maths. We are really fortunate that we have an excellent Maths subject leader Mrs Hurd (who is currently on maternity leave) who loves Maths and stresses to the children the importance of learning the basic multiplication facts. This is something that we try and instil in all our children and it is important to know that it is never too early to start to learn multiplication facts even in Cherry Class. Those of you, who have attended celebration assembly always tell me how amazed you are that children in Year 1 last year were able to recite the facts like 9 squared = 81 or 12 x 12 = 144. It really is a case

of over learning them, and reciting them at home, playing our FunKey Maths cards or playing TimesTables Rockstars. I cannot stress enough how like reading everyday is so important – **learning multiplication facts daily makes progress in Maths a lot easier.** With this in mind over the next few weeks we will be having a huge push on multiplication facts. Indeed looking at the TTRS stats today, 13% of the school from years 1 to 6 have played TTRS in the last week- this must increase – it is only 38 facts to learn!



Please spend some time learning multiplication facts daily. We want all children to aspire to learn all their multiplication facts by the mid point of Year 4; it can be done as lots of our children have done this in the past!
