House Points: Well done **Brabazon House**, who were house of term 1 with an incredible **4,174** points. It is worth remembering that they also received an extra 100 house points for winning the House Times Tables Rockstar competition.

Times Table Challenge: Quite rightly we are having a huge 'blitz' on multiplication facts and we continue to have an aspiration for all our children to know their multiplication facts as soon as they can. (This links clearly to my paragaraph about our high standards and expectations over the years!) A reminder that in Year 4 there is a statutory assessment MTC (Multiplication Tables Check) where children are expected to know all their times tables. Work we did in this week's staff meeting, looking at Maths, reinforced this importance. A a huge amount of mathematical concepts that children cover

in Year 5 and 6 are linked to a quick recall of times tables, which then continues in Secondary school. In the Year 6 Maths SATs papers this year (as in every year) a huge number of questions required children to have a very good recall and fluency of multiplication facts; to enable them to answer some of the questions. Please make sure that children are playing TTRS, Learning FunKey Maths games and completing their weekly homework multiplication strips. (See right) There are so many ways to learn multiplication facts (just roll dice and multiply them) Please ensure that you are helping your children to do so. Over the next week starting from Monday 11th to Monday 18th November we will be setting up another TTRS competition. On Class Dojo all the multiplication strips will be placed on as a PDF so you can have a copy
