Connected Curriculum Theme: Identity and diversity

Topic: The ancient kingdom of Benin, diversity in the UK and our own identity

Brave Changemakers Outcome: A 'Celebration of Diversity' – children will each produce a project that they can display that reflects their own identity.

Our Big Question: How do we celebrate diversity?

Learning questions:

What stereotypes and misconceptions do we have of African countries and civilizations?

What was life like in the ancient Kingdom of Benin? How did they express their identity?

What is it like to live in Benin/Nigeria now?

How diverse is the UK? Why? What are people's attitudes towards this? What is my identity?



Some Facts (Knowledge & Understanding)

The kingdom of Benin began in the 900s when the Edo people settled in the rainforests of West Africa. By the 1400s they had created a wealthy kingdom with a powerful ruler, known as the Oba. The Obas lived in beautiful palaces decorated with shining brass.

Gradually, the Obas won more land and built up an empire. They also started trading with merchants from Europe. For 200 years Benin was very successful, but in the 1600s the Obas started to lose control of their people. By the 1800s Benin was no longer strong or united. The kingdom came to a sudden end in 1897, when a British army invaded and made it part of the British Empire.
