Parent/ Carer's Survey Reflections and Next Steps: January 2025.

A fantastic 71 responses were given in December's Parent / Carer survey - which based questions around the features of anti-bullying and safety in school.

In this document you will find the responses to all the questions.

Please note that the results show the overall % and the number of parent's / carers (p/c) who made the responses. Some questions were not answered by a couple of parent/ carers so don't always total 71.

We are really pleased with the result, although as always there are a few things to work on. One area we are already looking to develop – is how we can support children to identify a 'trusted adult' and develop friendship ambassadors with respected Year 6's taking on the role to help support any difficulties at lunchtimes in a fair and consistent way without being judgemental. This is something that we hope to start soon.

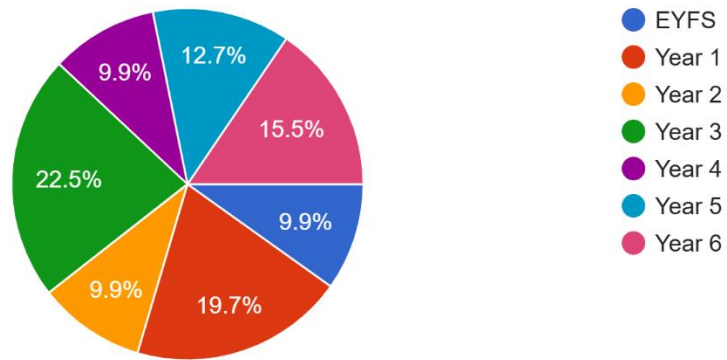

Development and next steps:

My child is in Year Group...

71 responses

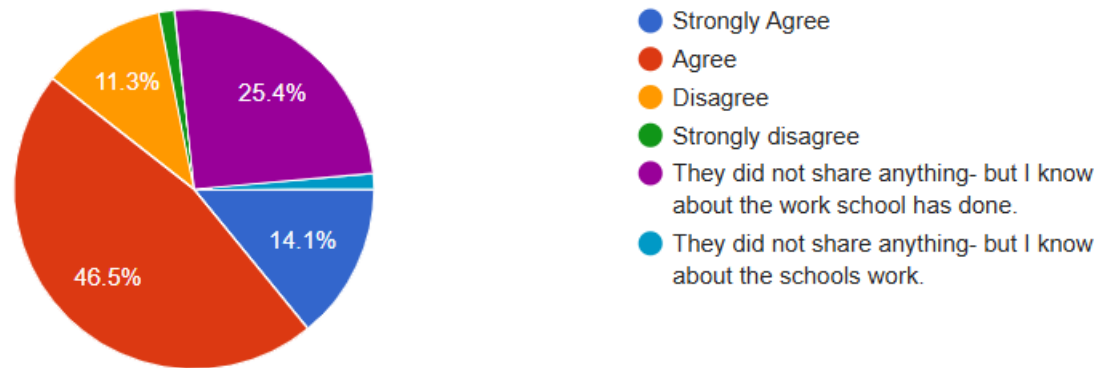


Good spread of responses from across the school, which means we have an adequate spread from right across the school.

1. My child was able to share at home, about some of the recent work they have done with the NSPCC and Anti-Bullying work.

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71 responses



60.6% - 43 p/c agreed and strongly agreed that children were able to share about the recent work we have done in school.

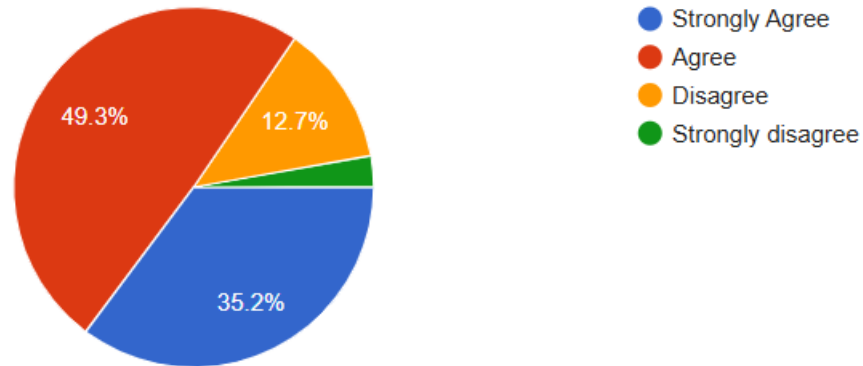
25.4% - 19 p/c knew about the work potentially from newsletters, Class Dojo etc.

13% - 9 p/c d- disagree and strongly disagreed that they did not know about the work.

Action: School to consider communication of the work before and more importantly after any events, to publicise the work we have done and subsequent follow up work. Eg any children's work on Class Dojo. Children's voice shown on Class Dojo.

2. My child feels that they can talk about any issues they may be having, to a trusted adult in school.

71 responses



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84.5 % - 60 p/c agreed / strongly agreed.

15.5 % = 11 p/c disagree/ strongly disagree.

Consideration how we can increase this number so that all children feel that they can talk to a trusted adult.

Ideas will be gathered from all children as part of child's voice work. Including thoughts around Year 6 friendship ambassadors.

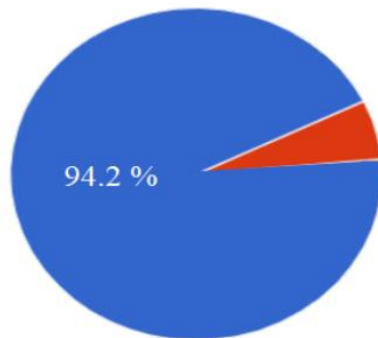
3. My child has been bullied at school recently and we have followed the school's official anti-bullying procedures.*

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(*Please note this means that the school's anti-bullying policy is being adhered to and regular meetings occur with senior leaders in school to monitor the concern until a satisfactory resolution is found.)

Please note we are talking about this academic year so far.

69 responses



- No - My child has not experienced bullying and so I have not had to use the school's official anti-bullying policy.
- Yes- I have followed the school's official anti-bullying policy as my child has experienced bullying. (Please see question 3a.)

69 * out of 71 answered this question.

94.2% = 65 p/c said no to their children experiencing any bullying. .

5.8 % = 4 p/c said their child had experienced bullying, which is slightly more than the number of cases that we have recorded and are currently working through with families now.

This is really pleasing to see this and that the vast majority of children feel safe in school.

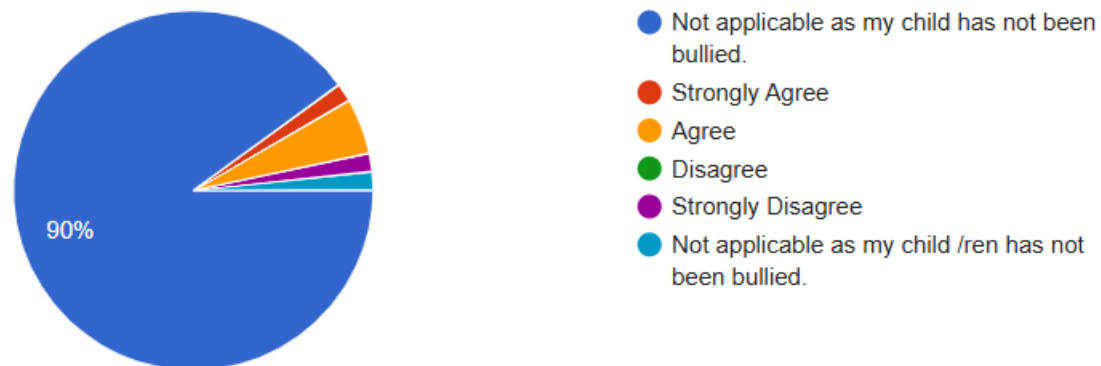
We continue to monitor all friendship issues when raised by parent / carers to try and prevent issues from escalating.

Follow up question to 3:

3a) The school dealt with the bullying concerns quickly and effectively when we were following the school's policy.

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60 responses



Although we only had four responses to the previous question: 'my child has experienced bullying' We had five direct responses to this question.

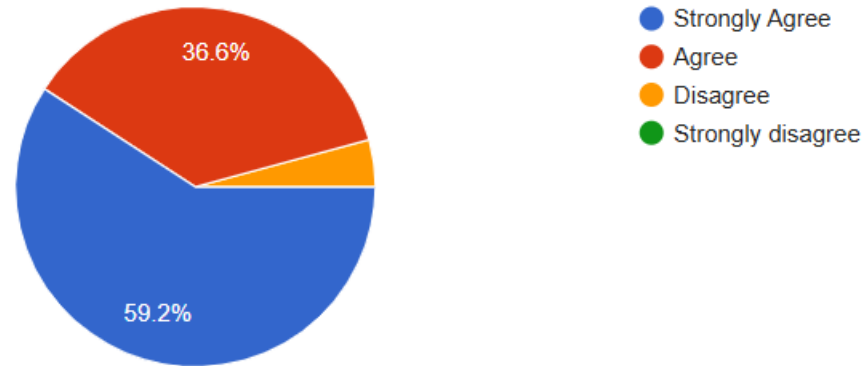
Four responses agreed and strongly agreed that it had been dealt with quickly and effectively.

One person – responded disagree to this – that we had not dealt with the issues.

4. My child, generally, has happy friendships with other children in school.

71 responses

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95.8 % = 68 p/c strongly agree / agree

4.2 % = 3 p/c disagree

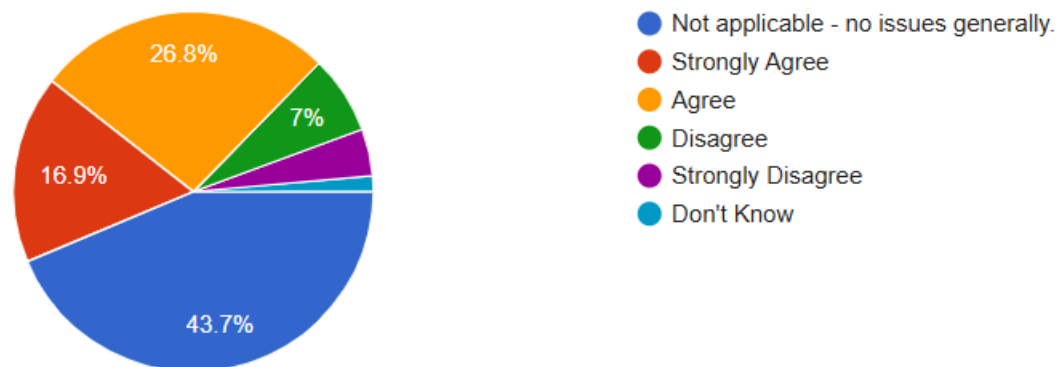
This is very pleasing to see and a credit to all the children in our school.

We would want to see this at 100% but need to consider how we can as a school support all children to have good, secure friendships.

5. My child does sometimes experience friendship issues with other children- and when we raise it - we feel school tries its best to resolve the issues.

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71 responses




43.7% = 31 p/c have not raised a concern.

43.7 = 31 p/c Agree / Strongly agree we try resolve problem when things are raised.

12.4 % = 9 p/c felt we are not able to resolve issues. This is something we want to improve and will consider the voice of the children on how we can do this and what strategies we could use to help and support

Action: This is something that we feel we need to improve. When things are raised by parents / carers, we endeavour to do our best with sorting situations, but sometimes we are not successful in our aims. We need to consider how we see things through fully to ensure that some

	children's issues are fully resolved.
