Our Big Question: *How can we help people to belong?*

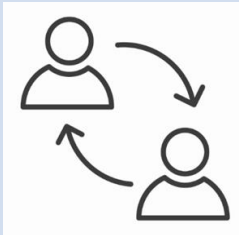


Overview:

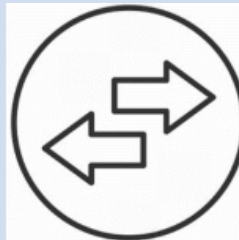
In Term 1 and 2 we will be exploring our Big Question: How can we help people to belong? Firstly we will look at rivers in Geography. We will discover the journey of a river and find out how they are used by people. We will investigate how rivers are and were used for trading and how start to explore international trade. In History, we will look at the Transatlantic Slave Trade and explore how Bristol was involved in that. This will link to our English text 'The Village that Vanished'. Later in our topic, we will investigate how the enslaved people were treated in America an how they found ways to build community and escape slavery. We will read the text 'Henry's Freedom Box' and investigate Harriet Tubman in History. We will then focus on how slavery was abolished and look at the Windrush generation reading extracts from Floella Benjamin's book 'Coming to England'. Finally, we will then learn about how 'Carnival' developed in the Caribbean and in the UK and will finish our topic by holding our own carnival celebration.
